Bottom right, the title "Bacon's Map of Northamptonshire, reduced from the Ordnance Survey. Divided into 5 mile squares." The British Museum copy of this was received, under the Copyright Act, in 1896 but it was evidently prepared a little before, as the projected Great Central Railway is not shown.

Mr. Basil L. Gimson, of Markfield, near Leicester, possesses a copy of this atlas, which seems to be a remainder of the 1895 edition with the date left out. All its maps seem identical with the corresponding maps in the 1895 edition.

An outline map coloured in parishes, showing towns, villages, roads, rivers, railways and canals, and ruled into oblongs numbered in Roman numerals and which are divided into lesser oblongs which are numbered in ordinary numerals, for six-inch and 25-inch surveys respectively. There is no border.

There was a reprint of the *Encyclopædia Britannica* in 1898. Although each title-page is printed with the same wording and the same date as on the original, a note on the backs of the title-pages of some of the volumes states that the work was reprinted in 1890, 1892, 1895, 1896 and 1898.

Bartholomew's name and the reference to the parliamentary divisions have been removed. Northamptonshire is now coloured solid pink and Leicestershire yellow. Railways have been brought up-to-date. Below the bottom border is now, left, "Page 555"; centre, "Encyclopædia Britannica Ninth Edition" (as before); and right, "W. & A. K. Johnston."
