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131a. **Blome, R.** A reprint of No. 121.

There is a copy of this hitherto unrecorded edition of the atlas in the Library of Sir Gyles Isham, Bart. at Lamport Hall, Northampton. The map of Northamptonshire seems unchanged.

503a. **Walker, J. & C.** A further reprint of No. 450. 497/508

IN HOBSON'S FOX-HUNTING ATLAS . . . (c. 1856). 541/559

The population of the county is given as 212,380 which is from the Census of 1851. A railway is shown, printed and coloured, with a station at Peakirk, from the Great Northern main line north of Peterborough towards Boston. The Leicester & Bedford Railway, previously shown as a dotted line (projected) is now coloured by hand. The Hunts are still unchanged from No. 535. I assume the date 1856 for this edition. Miss Joan Wake has produced a copy of this map from the Northamptonshire Record Society's collection.

669a. **Bartholomew, J.** A further reprint of No. 595.
